Be a Director

As a member of Pierce Pepin Cooperative Services (PPCS), you have an opportunity to make a difference—for your cooperative, for its members, and for the communities it serves. Accept the challenge! Serve on the PPCS Board of Directors and help guide this very progressive energy cooperative into the future.

Qualifications

- You are a cooperative member directly served by the cooperative, residing in a district up for election;
- You or your spouse have not been employed by the cooperative within the preceding five years;
- You or your spouse are not employed by or financially interested in a competing business, or a business selling electric energy, services or supplies to the cooperative;
- You or your spouse have not pursued any claim or litigation against the cooperative, its employees or directors within the preceding five years;
- You or your spouse have not been delinquent on any obligation owed the cooperative for more than 60 days within the preceding five years;
- You have not been convicted of a felony or breach of trust offense during your term of office or within the preceding five years of nomination or election to the board.

Responsibilities

- To maintain the legal entity of the cooperative;
- To act as trustee for the member-owners;
- To provide organizational and operational direction;

- To consider and adopt or approve specific actions in consultation with the President and Chief Executive Officer;
- To provide the continuing operating and capital requirements of the cooperative
- To establish and periodically review measures and controls as recommended by the President and Chief Executive Officer.

Duties

- Gain knowledge about the basic understanding of electricity; including production, distribution, transmission and generation.
- Read and become familiar with information, data, and reports pertaining to the cooperative.
- Attend all regular monthly board meetings, special board meetings, committee meetings and annual membership meetings. Regular monthly board meetings are typically held the first Thursday of each month at 7 p.m.
- Work in harmony with the board and management for the good of all cooperative members.

Benefits

- The Board of Directors offers a great opportunity to participate in a progressive member-owned utility and to be recognized as a leader in the community in which you live.
- As a director you will have the opportunity to travel to regional and national meetings to meet and exchange information and ideas with representatives from other electric cooperatives and affiliated organizations.
- Directors are paid a per diem for each regular board meeting, and for any additional meetings or service required.

How to Become a Director

The director nomination/ election processes takes place in conjunction with the Annual Meeting, which will be held on March 24, 2018. If you are interested in running for a director position, you must submit your

Board Makeup

PPCS' members are represented by a Board of nine directors, one from each of the nine districts that make up the cooperative's service area. Each year the membership elects a director from each

of three districts on a rotating basis. Directors are elected for three-year terms and are eligible to serve a maximum of four (4) successive three-year terms.

- District 1 Pepin County; Town of Maxville in Buffalo County
- District 2 Towns of Hartland, Maiden Rock and Isabelle in Pierce County
- District 3 Towns of Diamond Bluff and Trenton in Pierce County
- District 4 Towns of El Paso, Union, Salem, Rock Elm and Spring Lake in Pierce County
- District 5 Town of Ellsworth in Pierce County
- District 6 Town of Trimbelle in Pierce County
- District 7 Towns of Martell and Gilman in Pierce County; Towns of Eau Galle, Rush River, Kinnickinnic, Troy and Pleasant Valley in St. Croix County
- District 8 Town of River Falls in Pierce County
- District 9 Towns of Clifton and Oak Grove in Pierce County
